

8th Namdapha Butterfly Festival, 2025

1. Introduction

- The **8th Namdapha Butterfly Festival** will be held from **November 26 to 28, 2025**, at **Namdapha National Park and Tiger Reserve**, located in **Miao, Changlang district, Arunachal Pradesh**.
- It is organised by the **Department of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of Arunachal Pradesh**, in **collaboration with local community groups**.
- The event celebrates **biodiversity, eco-tourism, and community-led conservation** in one of India's richest ecological zones.

2. Objectives of the Festival

- **Promote eco-tourism** and sustainable livelihood opportunities for local communities.
- **Raise awareness** about biodiversity conservation and the ecological importance of the Namdapha landscape.

4. Namdapha National Park: A Global Biodiversity Hotspot

- Located in **Changlang district** of Arunachal Pradesh, Namdapha is both a **National Park and a Tiger Reserve**.

- It covers an area of about **1,985 sq km** and ranges from **200 m to over 4,500 m in altitude**, representing diverse ecosystems from tropical rainforest to alpine vegetation.
- Recognised as one of the **world's most biodiverse reserves** and a key part of the **Eastern Himalayas biodiversity hotspot**.
- Home to:
 - **Over 500 species of butterflies**
 - Rare butterflies such as **Kaiser-i-Hind, Blue Mormon, Peacock Pansy, Zig-zag Flat, and Yellow Veined Lancer**
 - Several rare and endangered fauna — including **tigers, clouded leopards, red pandas, and hornbills**.

5. Community Collaboration

- The 2025 festival is being jointly organised by:
 - **Tikak Homestay Miao**
 - **Khachang-Mattungkhim Youth Forum**
 - **Namdapha Jungle Camp Miao**
- These collaborations showcase **community-led conservation** and **eco-tourism initiatives**.
- Local youths and homestay owners act as **eco-guides**, demonstrating how **livelihood generation** and **biodiversity preservation** can go hand-in-hand.
