- Mohiniyattam
- Sattriya

Know:

- State of origin
- Themes
- Distinct features

(b) Folk Dances

- Regional folk dances often in news

- Instruments (string, wind, percussion)

- Famous gharanas (basic awareness)

- Full revision notes
- Mock tests

- NCERT (Class 11 – Indian Art & Culture)
- Selective chapters from standard reference books
- Current affairs compilations (culture-related)

□ Avoid multiple bulky sources.

Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Trying to study everything
- Ignoring visuals and images
- No revision of facts
- Skipping Art & Culture assuming low weightage
