- Spotting errors & sentence improvement: **30 minutes**
- Vocabulary & synonyms/antonyms: **20 minutes**
- Comprehension passages: **25 minutes**
- Revision: **15 minutes**

Smart Techniques

- Attempt **easy grammar questions first**
- Read questions before reading comprehension passage
- Skip confusing vocabulary questions initially

CDS General Knowledge Paper - Time Management Tips

Ideal Time Distribution

- Static GK (History, Polity, Geography, Science): **60 minutes**
- Current Affairs: **30 minutes**
- Revision: **30 minutes**

Smart Techniques

- First round: Attempt only **sure-shot questions**
- Second round: Educated guesses (only if elimination is possible)
- Never overthink GK questions

CDS Mathematics Paper - Time Management Tips

Ideal Time Distribution

- Arithmetic: **35 minutes**
- Algebra & Geometry: **40 minutes**
- Trigonometry & Mensuration: **20 minutes**
- Revision: **25 minutes**

Smart Techniques

- Solve questions mentally where possible
- Skip lengthy calculations initially
- Avoid spending more than **2 minutes on a single question**

Three-Round Attempt Strategy (Highly Effective)

Round 1 - Easy Questions

- Attempt direct, sure questions
- Build confidence
- Save time

Round 2 - Moderate Questions

- Slight calculations or logic
- Attempt with care

Round 3 - Risky Questions

- Attempt only if confident
- Avoid blind guessing

Handling Negative Marking Smartly

- One wrong answer = loss of marks
- Attempt only when:
 - You can eliminate at least **2 options**
- Leave questions blank if unsure

Exam Hall Time Management Tips

- Wear a wristwatch
- Don't panic if others finish early
- Stay calm and focused
- Fill OMR carefully to avoid mistakes

Last 15 Minutes Strategy

- Review marked questions
- Recheck OMR bubbling
- Correct calculation mistakes
- Avoid new risky attempts

Common Time Management Mistakes to Avoid

- Spending too much time on one question
- Over-attempting due to fear
- Poor OMR filling
- Not practicing mocks
