Difficulty Level: 10+2 level
Speed & accuracy are crucial

⚠ Negative Marking in CDS 2026

- **1/3 mark is deducted** for every incorrect answer
- No marks deducted for unattempted questions
- Smart guessing is essential to avoid loss of marks
