

# Chaman-Spin Boldak Border Crossing: Overview

## 1. Geographic and Strategic Location

- **Chaman Border Crossing** is one of the **major international border crossings** between **Pakistan and Afghanistan**.
- It connects:
  - **Chaman town** in **Chaman District, Balochistan (Pakistan)**
  - **Wesh and Spin Boldak** in **Kandahar Province (Afghanistan)**
- It forms part of a key route linking the **provincial capitals**:
  - **Quetta (Pakistan) ↔ Kandahar (Afghanistan)**
- Lies along the **Durand Line**, the disputed international border between Pakistan and Afghanistan.

## 2. Economic and Human Significance

- Around **10,000 people cross daily** for **trade, work, and family visits**, mainly from Pakistan into Wesh, Afghanistan, and return the same day.
  - It serves as a **vital trade and transit route**, particularly for goods moving between **South Asia and Central Asia**.
  - The crossing facilitates **local cross-border markets**, small-scale traders, and the **movement of agricultural products**

## 3. Spin Boldak City (Afghanistan)

- **Spin Boldak** (Pashto: بولدک سپين) is:
  - A **city** in **Kandahar Province**,
  - The **administrative capital** of **Spin Boldak District**.
- **Current Mayor:** *Lutfullah Latifi* (as per recent records).
- **Connectivity:**
  - North: Connected to **Kandahar city** by highway.

- South: Linked with **Chaman and Quetta** in Pakistan.
- **Border Feature:** The **Wesh-Chaman crossing** is located in the **southeast** of

#### 4. Demographics and Ethnic Composition

- The border area (Spin Boldak–Chaman) is primarily inhabited by **Pashtun tribes**.
- **Major tribes:**
  - **Noorzai**
  - **Achakzai**
- These tribes share strong **ethnic, cultural, and familial ties** across both sides of the border, facilitating informal trade and movement

#### 5. Political and Security Context

- On **14 July 2021**, during the **Taliban's 2021 offensive**,
  - **Taliban forces captured the Afghan side** of the Wesh–Chaman crossing.
  - This occurred before their eventual **takeover of Kabul in August 2021**.
- Control over this crossing provides strategic leverage in **trade revenues, cross-border movement, and customs control**.

#### 6. Symbolic and Structural Features

- A **“Friendship Gate”** was constructed in **2003** at the crossing.
  - It is a **brick, double-arched gate**, about **three stories tall**.
  - The side facing **Balochistan (Pakistan)** bears slogans:
    - **“Proud Pakistani”**

- **“Pakistan First”**

- The gate symbolizes **bilateral cooperation** but also underscores **national identity and border control**.

## **7. Operational Details**

- The **official operational hours**:
  - From **morning to sunset**.
- The crossing is used for:
  - **Trade transit**,
  - **Passenger movement**, and
  - **Bilateral official interactions** between customs and border authorities
