2. Master Reading Comprehension (RC)

How to Approach RC Passages

- Read questions first (optional)
- Skim passage to understand theme
- Re-read carefully for details
- Answer based on **passage logic only**

Key RC Question Types

- Main idea
- Inference

- Author's tone
- Fact vs opinion
- Title/summarization

☐☐ Avoid personal opinions while answering.

3. Vocabulary Preparation (Context-Based)

CLAT does **not** ask direct meanings.

Smart Vocabulary Strategy

- Learn words **from passages**
- Note:
 - Synonyms in context
 - Word usage
 - Tone of word
- Maintain a **contextual vocab notebook**

☐☐ Revise vocabulary weekly.

4. Grammar: What to Focus On (Minimal but Important)

Grammar is tested **indirectly**.

Important Grammar Areas

- Sentence structure
- Subject-verb agreement
- Modifiers
- Connectors & transitions
- Punctuation (basic)

☐☐ Do not over-study traditional grammar rules.

5. Practice with CLAT-Level Questions

What to Practice
