STEP-BY-STEP LEGAL REASONING PREPARATION STRATEGY

1. Understand the Core Structure of Legal Questions

Every CLAT legal question has:

1. **Principle** (legal rule)
2. **Facts** (given situation)
3. **Application** (connecting rule to facts)

☐☐ Always apply the principles **as given**, even if it differs from real law.

2. Important Legal Concepts to Master for CLAT 2027

High-Priority Legal Topics

- Torts (Negligence, Nuisance, Defamation)
- Contracts (Offer, Acceptance, Consideration)
- Criminal Law (Intention, Knowledge, Liability)
- Constitutional Law (Rights, Duties, Governance)
- Family Law (Marriage, Adoption basics)
- International Law (Basic treaties & principles)

☐☐ Focus on **conceptual clarity**, not depth.

3. Role of Legal Cases in CLAT Preparation

CLAT does **not** ask direct case laws, but:

- Cases help understand principles
- Current legal developments appear in passages
- Supreme Court judgments may be used as context

How to Study Cases

- Understand the **issue**
- Know the **principle applied**
- Focus on **impact**, not facts

4. How to Read Legal Passages Effectively

Legal Passage Reading Technique

- Read principle carefully
- Identify keywords (must, shall, liable)
- Read facts objectively
- Avoid assumptions beyond passage

Daily Practice Plan

- 2-3 legal passages/day (initial phase)

- Daily legal passages
 - Weekly full-length mocks
 - Focus on weak concepts
 - Revise legal terminology
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TOPPER TIPS FOR CLAT 2027 LEGAL REASONING

- ✓ Treat each passage as a new law
- ✓ Avoid real-world assumptions
- ✓ Eliminate extreme answer choices
- ✓ Focus on logical consistency
