The assessors—comprising psychologists, GTOs (Group Testing Officers), and Interviewing Officers—are trained to notice subtle cues in appearance and non-verbal communication. Your attire and body language often speak louder than words. A positive impression reinforces your Officer Like Qualities (OLQs), which are central to SSB selection.

Dress Code for SSB Interview

1. Reporting Day and Screening Test

- **Men:** Formal shirt and trousers, leather shoes (preferably black or brown), and a belt.
- **Women:** Formal Indian wear (salwar-kameez) or western formals (shirt with trousers or formal top with knee-length skirt), with flat or low-heel closed footwear.
- Keep your outfit neat, clean, and well-ironed.

2. Psychological Tests

- Dress comfortably, preferably in the same formal attire you wore on reporting day.
- Avoid flashy or overly casual clothes like jeans, t-shirts, or sneakers.

3. GTO Tasks

- **Men and Women:** White t-shirt, white shorts/track pants, and sports shoes with

white socks.

- Wear a white handkerchief or cloth if instructed for chest number visibility.
- Ensure good hygiene, clipped nails, and a clean haircut (men should be clean-shaven or well-groomed).

4. Personal Interview

- Dress in formal attire again.
- **Men:** Add a blazer or formal coat if possible.
- **Women:** A well-fitted formal dress or a sober salwar suit.
- Minimal accessories, light perfume/deodorant, and clean shoes.

5. Conference Day

- This is a formal occasion. Dress in the same formal attire as the interview day.
- Ensure shoes are polished, and grooming is perfect.

Body Language Tips for SSB Interview

1. Posture

- Stand and sit straight; avoid slouching.
- Keep your back erect with shoulders relaxed.
- Walk with purpose but without haste.

2. Eye Contact

- Maintain eye contact during conversation, but don't stare.
- Shows confidence, attentiveness, and respect.

3. Hand Gestures

- Use natural hand movements while speaking.
- Avoid excessive gesturing or fidgeting.

4. Handshake

- Offer a firm but not crushing handshake.
- Accompanied by a gentle smile and eye contact.

5. Facial Expressions

- Smile genuinely, especially when greeting or responding.
- Keep expressions neutral but alert when listening.

6. Nervous Habits to Avoid

- Tapping feet, biting nails, touching your face repeatedly, playing with a pen.
- These actions signal nervousness and a lack of self-control.

7. Sitting Etiquette

- Sit only when offered.
- Sit upright with hands resting on thighs or lap.
- Avoid crossing arms or legs aggressively.

Grooming and Hygiene Tips

- Maintain a clean-shaven look (for men) unless religious beliefs prohibit it.
- Get a professional haircut before the interview.
- Ensure clean fingernails, fresh breath, and trimmed nose/ear hair.
- Use subtle deodorants or perfumes; avoid strong scents.
- Wear clean, ironed clothes and polished shoes daily.

Quick Do's and Don'ts

Do's

Dress neatly and conservatively
Maintain eye contact and smile

Don'ts

Wear jeans, flashy or tight clothes
Stare or avoid eye contact

Do's

Use natural hand movements
Sit and stand with a straight posture
Wear polished shoes and groomed hair

Don'ts

Overuse gestures or fidget
Slouch or lean too much
Appear unkempt or messy
