☐☐ Vacancies in JAG Entry Scheme

The Indian Army releases a small number of vacancies for each JAG entry cycle:

- **Men:** Approx. 5
- **Women:** Approx. 2
- **Total:** Approx. 7 vacancies per course

Note: Vacancies may vary based on official notifications.

☐☐ Selection Process for Indian Army JAG Entry

1. **Online Application Submission**

Submit your application via the official website: www.joinindianarmy.nic.in

2. **Shortlisting of Candidates**

Based on **CLAT PG score**. Shortlisted candidates receive SSB call letters.

3. **SSB Interview (5 Days)**

Conducted at Allahabad, Bhopal, Bangalore, or Kapurthala. Includes:

- Stage I: Screening Test (OIR + PPDT)
- Stage II: Psychology Tests, Group Tasks, Personal Interview

4. **Medical Examination**

For candidates recommended by SSB.

5. **Final Merit List**

Based purely on **SSB marks**. CLAT score is only for shortlisting.

6. **Training at OTA Chennai**

Selected candidates undergo 49 weeks of military training.

- **Location:** Officers Training Academy (OTA), Chennai
- **Duration:** 49 weeks
- **Certification:** Post Graduate Diploma in Defence Management and Strategic Studies (University of Madras)
- **Cost of Training:** Entirely borne by Indian Army

Note: Candidates must remain unmarried during training.

1. Visit www.joinindianarmy.nic.in
2. Register/Login at Officer Entry section
3. Fill out the **JAG Entry Application Form**
4. Upload necessary documents (LLB Marksheet, CLAT PG Scorecard, etc.)
5. Submit and download the application form printout

Important: No offline applications are accepted.

☐☐ When to Apply?

Indian Army generally releases the **JAG Entry Notification** twice a year:

- **April Batch (Applications open in June-July of previous year)**
- **October Batch (Applications open in January-February)**

FAQs - Indian Army JAG Entry Scheme

What is JAG Entry in Indian Army?

JAG Entry is a direct entry scheme for **Law Graduates** to join the Indian Army as **Short Service Commissioned Officers** in the legal branch.

Is there a written exam in JAG Entry?

No. Candidates are shortlisted based on **CLAT PG score** and then directly called for **SSB Interview**.

☐ What is the age limit for JAG Entry?

21 to 27 years as on the cutoff date mentioned in the official notification.

☐ How many vacancies are there in JAG Entry?

Usually, around **5 seats for men** and **2 seats for women**, but it varies slightly each cycle.

☐ Can women apply for JAG Entry?

Yes. Both **male and female law graduates** are eligible to apply.

☐ What is the duration of training?

49 weeks at **Officers Training Academy (OTA), Chennai**.

☐ What is the salary after JAG Entry?

Starting pay is ₹56,100 per month (Basic Pay), plus allowances and perks as a **Lieutenant**.

☐ Is Permanent Commission available in JAG Entry?

Yes. After serving under **Short Service Commission (10 years extendable to 14 years)**, officers may apply for **Permanent Commission** based on eligibility.

☐ When is the JAG Entry notification released?

Typically, **twice a year** – around **June-July** and **January-February**.
