GARUDA AIR EXERCISE 2025

1.Introduction

- Garuda is a bilateral air-combat exercise between the Indian Air Force (IAF) and the French Air and Space Force (FASF).
- The 2025 edition is being held at Mont-de-Marsan Air Base, France.
- It reflects the growing **strategic convergence** between India and France in the Indo-Pacific and defence domains.

2. Key Objectives of the Exercise

a. Enhancing Interoperability

- Develop the ability of both air forces to operate together seamlessly in multidomain combat environments.
- Improve **communication protocols**, mission coordination and airspace deconfliction.

b. Strengthening Air-Combat Skills

- Practice air-to-air engagements, beyond-visual-range (BVR) combat and close-combat manoeuvres.
- Simulate complex threats that resemble modern aerial warfare conditions.

c. Refining Air Defence and Strike Capabilities

- Execute **air defence missions**, intercept protocols, and defensive counter-air operations.
- Conduct **joint strike missions** using mixed fighter formations (IAF + French fighters).

d. Tactical Learning & Doctrinal Exchange

- Exchange best practices related to:
 - mission planning
 - threat assessment

- electronic warfare
- pilot training
- operational philosophy of both air forces

3. Indian Assets Participating

a. Fighter Aircraft

• **Six Sukhoi-30MKI** — India's frontline multirole fighters known for manoeuvrability and long-range operations.

b. Support Platforms

- IL-78 Mid-Air Refueller extends aircraft endurance for long missions.
- **C-17 Globemaster-III** heavy-lift transport aircraft for personnel and equipment movement.

4. French Participation

- Rafale multirole fighters and other FASF platforms.
- Advanced avionics and combat systems of the Rafale provide high-end training value for IAF pilots.

5. Operational Activities During the Exercise

a. Simulated Combat Scenarios

- Offensive counter-air and defensive counter-air missions.
- Suppression of enemy air defences (SEAD).
- Large force engagements (LFE).

b. Mid-Air Refuelling & Long-Endurance Missions

Enhances capability for long-range strike and persistent air presence.

• Mixed-aircrew planning, execution and debriefing to refine joint operations.
