INTRODUCTION: WHY GS PAPER I IS A RANK-DECIDING PAPER

GS Paper I is often underestimated but plays a **critical role in final ranking**. It tests:

- Conceptual clarity
- Interdisciplinary thinking
- Analytical ability
- Answer writing skills

Unlike GS II or III, **GS I is static-heavy but dynamic in application**, demanding integration of **history, geography, society, and culture** with contemporary relevance.

Q1. Is GS Paper I static or dynamic?

It is **static in content but dynamic in application**.

Q2. How many marks can GS I fetch?

A good attempt can fetch **100-120+ marks**, which is rank-deciding.

Q3. Is map practice compulsory?
