- Shortlisting based on NEET score

Step 4: Interview & Medical Examination

- Psychological Interview
- Strict Military Medical Fitness Test

Step 5: Admission & Training

- Admission in one of the Armed Forces Nursing Colleges
- 4 years of military nursing training
- Monthly stipend during training
