Step 1: Check Overall Performance

Analyze:

- Total score
- Attempted questions
- Accuracy percentage
- Time taken per section

□□ This gives performance overview.

Step 2: Section-Wise Performance Analysis

Check:

- English score trend
- GK accuracy
- Legal reasoning mistakes
- Logical reasoning speed
- Quant calculation errors

□□ Helps target weak sections.

Step 3: Question-Level Analysis (Most Important Step)

Divide mistakes into 4 categories:

1. Concept Mistake

→ Didn't know concept

2. Silly Mistake

→ Knew concept but made careless error

3. Time Pressure Mistake

→ Rushed due to low time

4. Guessing Mistake

→ Random answer attempt

□□ This step improves score fastest.

Step 4: Make a Mock Test Error Notebook

Write:

- Wrong questions
- Correct concept explanation
- Short tricks or notes
- Vocabulary / legal principle learned

□□ Revise mistake notebook weekly.

Step 5: Track Progress After Every Mock

Track:

- Score improvement
- Accuracy improvement
- Time management improvement

□□ Mock tests = Performance tracking tool.

Best Mock Test Strategy for CLAT 2027

Phase 1: Foundation Phase

Focus:

- Accuracy building

- Understanding paper structure
- Section familiarity

Phase 2: Performance Phase

Focus:

- Speed improvement
- Section order testing
- Time distribution

Phase 3: Final Phase (Last 3 Months)

Focus:

- Full exam simulation
- Pressure handling
- Score maximization

Golden Rules of Mock Test Analysis

- Spend 2-3 hours analyzing 2-hour mock
- Never repeat same mistake twice

Last 3 Months Mock Test Plan for CLAT 2027

Week Plan Example:

- 3 Full Mocks
- 2 Sectional Tests
- 1 Full Mock Analysis Day

Mock Test Score vs Real Exam Score

Students who:
