- Helipad security and special force missions including:
 - Reconnaissance and surveillance
 - Special Heliborne Operations (SHBO)
 - Small Team Insertion and Extraction (STIE)
- Drone operations and Counter-UAS (Unmanned Aerial Systems) measures
- Logistical support and air operations for sustained deployment in hostile terrain

The primary aim of **Exercise DUSTLIK-VI** is to strengthen **military interoperability**, enhance **tactical coordination**, and foster **mutual trust** between the armed forces of India and Uzbekistan.

The joint drill serves as a platform to:
