2. Tell me about your family background

Purpose: To evaluate your values and upbringing.

Tip: Speak respectfully about your family members. Mention their occupation, your relationship with them, and any influence they've had on your goals.

3. Why do you want to join the Indian Armed Forces?

Purpose: To test your motivation and clarity of ambition. **Tip**: Avoid vague statements. Be specific. Share personal reasons or incidents that inspired you.

4. What are your strengths and weaknesses?

Purpose: To assess self-awareness and honesty.

Tip: Choose strengths that align with OLQs. When sharing weaknesses, mention what steps you're taking to overcome them.

5. How do you spend your leisure time?

Purpose: To understand your lifestyle and time management. **Tip**: Highlight productive hobbies like sports, reading, volunteering, or learning new skills.

6. Questions Based on Your PIQ Form

Most questions will stem from the **Personal Information Questionnaire (PIQ)** you fill on Day 1. Expect questions such as:

- Why did you choose your academic stream?
- Which is your favorite subject and why?
- Tell me about any leadership experience you had.
- What role did you play in extracurricular activities?

7. Questions Related to Academics and Career Choices

You may be asked:

- Why did you score low in a particular subject?
- Why pursue the Armed Forces with your current degree?
- What are your future plans if not selected?

8. Do you have a girlfriend or boyfriend? What do you do together?

Purpose: To assess your maturity and honesty. **Tip**: Be truthful and handle the question respectfully without feeling awkward.

9. Current Affairs and General Awareness

Stay updated with:

• Recent defense deals and exercises.

- Names of top military and political leaders.
- Ongoing national and international events.
- Awards, geography, and current government schemes.

10. Hypothetical Situations and Decision-Making

Questions like:

- What will you do if your friend cheats in an exam?
- How will you convince your parents to let you join the Armed Forces?

Purpose: To evaluate judgment, ethics, and leadership.

LESS COMMON BUT IMPACTFUL QUESTIONS

- Who is your role model and why?
- Describe a challenge you overcame.
- If you fail this time, what is your backup plan?
- How do your friends describe you?
- Do you believe in luck or hard work?

TIPS TO ACE THE PERSONAL INTERVIEW

- Be truthful and confident.
- Know your PIQ thoroughly.
- Practice public speaking and mock interviews.
- Dress formally and maintain proper posture.
- Maintain eye contact and stay calm under pressure.
- Use real-life examples while answering.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

Q1. How long does the personal interview last in SSB?

It usually lasts between 30 to 60 minutes depending on the depth of questioning.

Q2. Is English mandatory for the SSB Interview?

No, it is not mandatory, but English is preferred and gives you an advantage.

Q3. What happens if I lie in the interview?

Lying is discouraged. Officers are trained to detect inconsistencies, and dishonesty can lead to rejection.

Q4. Can I use humor during the interview?

Yes, but only if it is appropriate and respectful. Avoid sarcasm or trying too hard to be funny.

Q5. How can I best prepare for the personal interview?

- Self-reflection and introspection.
- Practicing common questions with friends or mentors.
- Reading newspapers and current affairs.
- Revising your academics and PIQ content.
