3. Morning for Maths, Evening for GK

- Maths and problem-solving are best done in the morning with a fresh mind.
- Use evenings for History, Geography, or revision.

4. Current Affairs Daily

- Spend **30 minutes daily** reading newspapers (*The Hindu/Indian Express*).
- Make short notes for monthly revision.

5. Weekly Mock Test

- Take **one full-length test every Sunday**.
- Analyze mistakes and adjust study routine accordingly.

Exam-Day Time Management Tips

Mathematics (120 Questions - 150 Minutes)

- Allocate **30 minutes for easy questions, 60 minutes for moderate ones, and 50 minutes for tough ones**.
- Use a **3-round strategy**:
 - Round 1 → Attempt sure-shot questions.
 - Round 2 → Attempt medium difficulty.
 - Round 3 → Attempt tricky questions if time permits.

General Ability Test (150 Questions - 150 Minutes)

- Attempt **English first** (50 questions in 30–35 minutes).
- Then move to GK (120 minutes). Prioritize subjects you're strongest in.
- Don't waste time on questions you don't know — mark and return later.

Long-Term Time Management (6-Month Plan for NDA April 2026)

- **Months 1-2:** Build strong basics with NCERTs and start Maths problem-solving.
- **Months 3-4:** Add mock tests, focus on advanced topics, strengthen weak areas.
- **Months 5-6:** Full-length tests, rapid revision, current affairs focus.
