2. Eligibility Criteria UPSC vs KAS

UPSC Civil Services Eligibility:

- Nationality: Indian Citizen (for IAS & IPS)
- Educational Qualification: Bachelor's degree from a recognized university
- Age Limit: 21-32 years (with relaxation for OBC, SC/ST, etc.)
- Number of Attempts: General - 6, OBC - 9, SC/ST - Unlimited (until age limit)

KAS Eligibility:

- Nationality: Indian Citizen
- Educational Qualification: Bachelor's degree from a UGC-recognized university
- Age Limit:
 - **Stream 1 (General Recruitment):** 21-32 years
 - **Stream 2 (Departmental Recruitment):** 21-40 years
 - **Stream 3 (Promotion Quota):** Must be under 50 years
- Age Relaxation: Available for OBC, SC/ST, differently-abled, and ex-servicemen

3. UPSC & KAS Exam Pattern & Syllabus

UPSC Civil Services Exam Pattern:

1. Prelims:

- Paper 1: General Studies (History, Polity, Economy, Geography, Science & Tech, Current Affairs)
- Paper 2: CSAT (Qualifying)

2. Mains: 9 papers (Essay, General Studies I-IV, Optional Subject I & II, Compulsory Indian Language, and English)

3. Interview: Personality Test

KAS Exam Pattern:

1. Prelims:

- Paper 1: General Studies (Kerala-specific & national topics)
- Paper 2: Language Proficiency (Malayalam/Tamil/Kannada) & Reasoning

2. Mains: 3 papers (Essay, General Studies I-III)

3. Interview: Personality Test

Key Differences:

- UPSC covers **wider subjects** including international relations, ethics, and

multiple optional subjects.

- KAS focuses on **Kerala-specific topics** like governance, history, and current affairs.

4. Career Opportunities & Growth

UPSC Civil Services:

- Officers are appointed in **central government** and can serve in different states.
- Career progression: District Collector → Secretary → Chief Secretary → Cabinet Secretary (highest post).
