# UPSC Prelims Syllabus & Preparation Strategy

The UPSC Civil Services Preliminary Examination (Prelims) is the first stage of the IAS exam and serves as a screening test for the UPSC Mains. It consists of two papers: General Studies Paper I and the CSAT (General Studies Paper II).

Understanding the syllabus thoroughly and preparing strategically is essential to clear this stage.

### **UPSC Prelims Exam Pattern**

Paper	Subject	Marks	No. of Questions	Duration	Negative Marking
Paper I	General Studies (GS)	200	100	2 Hours	Yes (1/3rd per wrong answer)
Paper II	CSAT (Aptitude Test)	200	80	2 Hours	Yes (1/3rd per wrong answer)

- Paper I (General Studies I) is counted for merit and determines selection for Mains.
- Paper II (CSAT) is qualifying (33% or 66 marks required to pass).
- Both papers are **objective type** (MCQs) and conducted on the **same day**.

- Key Geographical Features, Climate, Resources

#### 3. Indian Polity & Governance

- Constitution, Political System, Panchayati Raj
- Public Policy, Rights Issues

#### 4. Economic & Social Development

- Sustainable Development, Poverty, Inclusion
- Government Schemes & Economic Policies

#### 5. Environment & Ecology

- Biodiversity, Climate Change, Environmental Issues

- 3. Basic Numeracy (Class 10 level Maths)
