

SSB Interview: A Complete Guide

The **SSB (Services Selection Board) Interview** is a **five-day selection process** conducted by the Indian Armed Forces to recruit officers for the **Army, Navy, and Air Force**. It is one of the toughest and most prestigious selection processes in India.

1. What is the SSB Interview?

The **SSB Interview** is designed to assess a candidate's **Officer-Like Qualities (OLQs)** such as leadership, decision-making, intelligence, teamwork, and psychological stability.

The interview is conducted for candidates who apply for officer-level positions through various entries like **NDA, CDS, AFCAT, TES, INET, NCC Special Entry, and Direct Entries**.

2. Eligibility for SSB Interview

You can appear for the SSB Interview through the following exams and entries:

Entry	Conducting Body	Eligibility
NDA (National Defence Academy)	UPSC	10+2 (Physics & Maths)
CDS (Combined Defence Services)	UPSC	Graduate (Any Stream for Army, B.Tech for Navy/Air Force)
AFCAT (Air Force Common Admission Test)	Indian Air Force	Graduate (Any Stream for Ground Duty, B.Tech for Technical Branch)
TES (Technical Entry Scheme)	Indian Army	10+2 with PCM (Minimum 60%)
INET (Indian Navy Entrance Test)	Indian Navy	B.Tech/B.E
NCC Special Entry	Indian Army/Navy/Air Force	NCC 'C' Certificate Holders (Graduate)

If you qualify in any of these entries, you will receive an **SSB call letter** for the interview.

3. SSB Interview Process (5 Days)

The **SSB Interview** takes place over **five days** and includes multiple tests to evaluate your **intelligence, personality, and officer-like qualities**.

Day 1: Screening Test (Stage 1)

The first day consists of two tests:

1. OIR Test (Officer Intelligence Rating Test)

- Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning Questions
- Simple Logical & Analytical Questions
- 50-55 Questions in 30 Minutes

2. PPDT (Picture Perception and Description Test)

- A blurry picture is shown for **30 seconds**
- Candidates write a story based on the picture (**4 minutes**)
- Group Discussion on the story (**8-10 candidates per group**)

Result:

- Candidates who perform well in **OIR & PPDT** move to **Stage 2**
- Candidates who fail are **screened out** and sent home

Day 2: Psychological Tests

This stage assesses a candidate's **thinking, personality, and decision-making** through written tests.

1. TAT (Thematic Apperception Test)

- **12 pictures are shown** (including one blank slide)
- Candidates have **30 seconds to see the picture** and **4 minutes to write a story**

2. WAT (Word Association Test)

- **60 words are shown (one at a time for 15 seconds each)**
- Candidates write the first thought that comes to mind for each word

3. SRT (Situation Reaction Test)

- **60 real-life situations** are given
- Candidates write their reactions within **30 minutes**

4. SDT (Self-Description Test)

- Candidates write about their **strengths, weaknesses, aspirations, and what others think of them**

Day 3 & 4: GTO (Group Testing Officer) Tasks

These tests evaluate **teamwork, leadership, problem-solving, and communication skills**.

1. GD (Group Discussion)

- Two topics are given for discussion (Current Affairs, Social Issues, Military Topics)
- Candidates must present logical and structured arguments

2. GPE (Group Planning Exercise)

- A situation is given with multiple problems (e.g., a village under attack, an injured person needs help)
- The group must plan a solution using available resources

3. PGT (Progressive Group Task)

- The group crosses obstacles using planks, ropes, and wooden structures
- Tests teamwork and problem-solving

4. HGT (Half Group Task)

- Similar to PGT but with **fewer members**

5. Individual Obstacles

- 10 obstacles to complete within **3 minutes** (e.g., rope climbing, jumping over walls)

6. Command Task

- Candidates act as leaders and command others to solve an obstacle

7. Lecturette

- Candidates select a topic and **speak for 3 minutes**

8. FGT (Final Group Task)

- The last group task similar to PGT

Day 5: Personal Interview & Conference

1. Personal Interview

- Conducted by senior officers
- Questions about **personal life, academics, hobbies, and general knowledge**
- Tips: Be honest, confident, and clear in your answers

2. Conference Round

- A panel of officers discusses a candidate's overall performance
- Candidates may be asked general questions
- **Final recommendation given** based on overall performance

4. SSB Interview Result & Medical Examination

- If you **clear the SSB Interview**, you undergo a **medical examination**
- Final selection is based on **medical fitness and merit list**

5. Tips to Crack SSB Interview

General Preparation:

- ☐ Stay updated with **current affairs**
- ☐ Improve **communication skills**
- ☐ Practice **writing stories (TAT), word association (WAT), and situation reaction (SRT)**

For Screening Test:

- ☐ Solve **verbal & non-verbal reasoning questions**
- ☐ Practice **story writing and group discussions**

For Psychological Tests:

- ☐ Be **positive and honest** in your responses
- ☐ Write **logical and meaningful** stories in TAT
- ☐ Answer **WAT & SRT spontaneously**

For GTO Tasks:

- ☐ Be **active and cooperative**
- ☐ Take the **lead when necessary**
- ☐ Show **confidence and problem-solving ability**

For Personal Interview:

- ☐ Dress well and maintain **good body language**
- ☐ Be **honest and clear** in your answers
- ☐ Show **confidence but don't be overconfident**
